Chennai Port Wins IAPH Sustainability Award 2024 in Community Building Category

Chennai Port has emerged as the winner of the IAPH Sustainability Award 2024 in the Community Building category. This accolade marks Chennai Port as the first Indian port ever to receive such significant global recognition for its innovative initiatives that extend beyond traditional port operations, focusing on community welfare and environmental preservation.

The World Ports Sustainability Program (WPSP) of IAPH aims to showcase the global leadership of ports in contributing to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The WPSP recognizes exemplary ports with the IAPH Sustainability Award for their outstanding efforts and best practices. Chennai ports efforts over the years towards our mission to "Act as a catalyst for sustained development of the Region" was encapsulated for WPSP. The submission was selected into top 3 finalist under community building category by expert jury among more than 71 projects from 50 ports globally, and emerged as winner.

Shri Indranil Hazra, Secretary of Chennai Port received award at the World Ports Conference on 9th October, where he expressed heartfelt gratitude to the Government of India for its progressive policies that have paved the way for this recognition. He thanked the Chennai Port Authority for its inclusive approach and acknowledged the unwavering support of the people of Chennai and their alignment with the Port's vision.

Championing Community Empowerment and Sustainable Growth

Chennai Port, one of India's oldest Major Ports, stands as a testament to resilience and progress. Established officially in 1881, its historical roots trace back to cargo operations dating all the way to 1639 AD. Over the past century and a half, Chennai Port has played a pivotal role in catalyzing regional growth, fostering trade, and driving commerce.

Community building and Education

Chennai Port Authority focuses not only on "what to achieve" but also on "what impact it creates". It empathizes with the community and the mother earth and listens within to make the world sustainable.

Therefore, beyond its core port-related services, Chennai Port has actively engaged with the community, focusing on empowerment and sustainability. We have made significant contributions in the field of education:

1. Empowerment through Education:

For over five decades, Chennai Port's school has been a beacon of learning, providing quality education to more than 50,000 students. The school boasts clean, hygienic classrooms, well-stocked libraries, fully equipped laboratories, and spacious playgrounds. The schooling is provided with minimal cost and all essentials like Textbooks, Stationeries, Uniform, etc. are provided free of cost.

2. Specialized Support:

Recently, Chennai Port identified the need for empowerment of the Special Children and established the Swabodhini School and Vocational Centre for Special Children in the neighbouring deprived area.

This innovative initiative currently benefits 24 autistic students with tailored education, therapy, and holistic support. The school's curriculum integrates academic, social, and life skills development. Structured learning, communication skills, sensory integration, and therapeutic support ensure individualized attention for students with autism. Through acceptance, understanding, and empowerment, the school positively impacts not only its students but also the broader community.

3. Community Engagement:

Chennai Port recognized the need for improving the quality of life of its community and has provided the Sports and recreation facilities with dedicated full-sized stadium, running track, basketball court, tennis court, two volleyball courts, and a beach volleyball court to promote physical fitness and community bonding. A large community hall acts as a multipurpose space serving as a hub for cultural events, gatherings and community programmes. Through this pioneering initiative, Chennai Port provides these facilities at free of cost, ensuring healthy and quality lives to the community.

4. Socio-Economic Development:

Besides securing nations' future through engaging and developing young minds, the Port's vision encompasses socio-economic development. The port recognizes fishermen as an important maritime stakeholder and, therefore, it has undertaken a large modernization project for Chennai Fishing Harbour (CFH). Chennai Fishing Harbour, one of the largest fishing harbours of India, provides fisheries-related facilities to thousands of fishermen and shelters over 2000 fishing boats. The harbour witnesses' ingress/ egress of 30,000 persons daily for fishing activities or fish-related businesses and handles approximately 500 MT (metric tons) of sea catches daily.

Chennai Port, under the scheme of Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojna, is establishing modern infrastructure and upgrading existing facilities to enhance facilities for fishermen, increase their income and generate employment opportunities which are expected to uplift lives of tens of thousands of fishermen in the region.

5. Community Welfare:

In addition to the flagship community empowerment initiatives, Chennai Port has actively engaged in various healthcare, welfare, and education endeavors. Healthcare and Welfare Initiatives include Women's Empowerment through training on Self Defense to Girl students, Assisting the Visually Impaired via Smart vision devices and AI technology, Emergency Services, Infrastructure Development such as water tanks, roads, hygienic toilet blocks, etc. We are improving education and training in the community through Digital Classrooms and Modern learning environment, Imparting Skill Training, Building schools and renovating school buildings, etc.
